Terms & Conditions

Bookings

All advance bookings will be confirmed by email whenever possible. Confirmations that cannot be emailed will be sent by post.

Your Booking Confirmation email or letter will be your proof of purchase and must be presented on arrival, together with ID.

Bookings will be valid only for the event days specified, are non-refundable and may not be exchanged without written permission of the organisers.

Children

Admission for under 16s is free of charge, but tickets must be booked and wristbands worn.

Proof of age may be required for teenagers under 16, so please ensure that this is available when arriving. Children must be supervised at all times.

There will be a Lost Children safe area at Reception. Please ensure that everyone in your family is aware of its location. Under 16s will be allowed into all outdoor venues. The late night sessions in Bisley Pavilion will be for adults only.

Wristbands

Booking Confirmations must be presented at the gate, to be exchanged for event wristbands, which must be worn at all times.

Wristbands are non-transferable and will be invalid if removed.

Replacements for lost, damaged or cut wristbands will be charged at the on-the-day ticket price.

Your wristband will give you access to all entertainment on site as well as the oval track day on Saturday.

Admission to the oval track is for Hot Rod Hayride wristband holders only.

Arrival

There will be a clearly signposted Hot Rod Hayride entry and exit gate on Queens Road.

Do not try to use the Main Gate of the Shooting Centre.

Gates will be open to ticket holders from 2pm for Thursday arrivals and from 9am for Friday or Saturday arrivals.

You must adhere to marshals' instructions and event signage at all times.

Show Field & Car Parking

On arrival, the car club Marshals will issue stickers to pre-1966 hot rods, customs, cars, trucks and motorcycles, which will then be eligible to park on the Show Field and in front of Bisley Pavilion.

Later vehicles are welcome at the event but must be parked outside of the designated pre-1966 areas.

Parking will be free of charge.

Disabled Visitors

If you require a disabled parking space, this must be booked in advance and you must provide a copy of your Blue Badge.

If you are disabled and require camping you will be able to camp next to your vehicle. On arrival, please speak to the Marshals, who will direct and assist you.

Please be aware that some of the event will be on a grass surface. This is well maintained but wheelchair users or people with mobility problems may need some assistance.

Venues

The main stage and dance floor will be covered, inside an open-sided marquee. There will be a bar close by, in another large marquee. The areas between and around the marquees are not covered.

Late night entertainment will be indoors, in the Bisley Pavilion.

The oval track is approximately 40 minutes' drive from Bisley Camp, at Tongham Raceway.

Food & Drink

There are a range of food options - including vegetarian and vegan - available from the food concessions near the music marquee and there will be a fully stocked licensed bar near the main music marquee.

Food and drink will also be served at many of the Historic Club Houses and Pavilions around the site.

You are welcome to bring your own food and drinks, but these must not be taken into the licensed buildings on site.

Vehicle Insurance

All vehicles on site (apart from historic racing cars on display) must be road legal and insured.

We reserve the right to refuse entry to any vehicle that does not meet this standard.

Trailers and Oversized Vehicles

Vehicles and caravans over 25' long will not be admitted to the site.

Please do not arrive with oversized vehicles as entry will be refused and no refund will be given.

All show cars must be driven and must be road legal. Trailers will not be allowed on site.

Speed Limit

The speed limit anywhere on the event site at Bisley, and at Tongham Raceway, is 5mph (roughly walking pace).

There is a site curfew for vehicle movement at 8pm each evening (apart from departures or as directed by Marshalls). We reserve the right to confiscate keys from anyone driving irresponsibly.

Soapbox Derby

Spectators must remain behind the barriers at all times.

Contestants should sign-on in advance at the Hayride Merchandise Tent.

Soapboxes must be built in a nostalgia style, to the following specifications, and will be disqualified if deemed to be unsafe:

- 1. Max length 5' (152cm)
- 2. Max width 40" (102cm)
- 3. Max weight 80kg
- 4. The body and chassis must be made of wood (metal axles and steering parts are allowed)
- 5. Soapbox must have 4 wheels and be stable
- 6. A working brake must be fitted
- 7. Engines or any form of propulsion are not allowed
- 8. Safety helmets and gloves must be worn, and arms must be covered

Oval Track Vehicles

Note: Oval Track Racing will take place at Tongham Raceway, approx. 40 mins drive (25 miles) from Bisley

- 1. Owners of pre-1966 vehicles wishing to run on the oval track can register at the Detonators Car Club Marquee on the Show Field
- 2. Registration and scrutineering will be at 17.00-19.00 on Friday at the Detonators Car Club Lodge on the Show Field. If time allows, late arrivals may be scrutineered at Race Control at the Track on Saturday, 11.00-11.30
- 3. The Detonators Car Club will confirm eligibility and provide further information
- 4. The number of vehicles included may be limited and The Detonators' decision regarding eligibility and inclusion is final
- 5. All participants must sign a disclaimer before taking part
- 6. Please be aware that any form of motorsport can be dangerous
- 7. The Hot Rod Hayride does not insure your car and accepts no liability for any loss, damage, injury or death caused by taking part

Local Hotels and B&Bs

Hayriders can stay off site but must show their wristbands on arrival and departure.

Camping – General

All camping, caravan, trailer tent and camper van pitches must be pre-booked.

Pre-booked campers can arrive on Thursday between 2pm and 10pm, on Friday between 9am and midnight, and on Saturday from 9am. Please do not arrive outside these times, as entry to the site may not be possible.

Pre-booked caravans and camper vans will be issued with a pass which must be displayed to gain access to the campsite.

On arrival, your pitch will be allocated by site Marshals and you must set up within the designated area.

We reserve the right to move your tent, caravan, vehicle and possessions if set up in the wrong position.

Each pitch is for a couple or a family group totalling a maximum of 4 people (children included).

Your pitch does not include water or electrical hook up.

Shower and toilet blocks with lighting and hot & cold water are provided throughout the site. Their positions are marked on the Site Plan in the Handbook.

Generators must comply with Health & Safety regulations and must be turned off if considered to be causing a noise nuisance to neighbours.

Anyone ignoring site safety instructions or causing a nuisance will be ejected with no refund.

No glass is to be brought onto the campsite.

Security staff will patrol the site regularly.

Please be aware that in many of the designated camping areas, including Glamping, tents and car parking are separate. In these areas you will not be able to park next to your tent. You will be able to unload at the edge of the camping field, before moving your car to a parking space.

Pitch Sizes

Maximum pitch size for tents is 5m x 8m, including guy ropes.

Maximum length for motor homes or caravans is 25ft.

Camping - Caravans, Trailer Tents and Camper Vans

All towed trailer tents, vintage caravans, teardrop caravans, camper vans, etc must park in the designated caravan areas.

Small awnings are allowed but tents must not be pitched next to caravans, camper vans, etc.

All caravans must be equipped with their own Fire Extinguisher.

Glamping

Glamping reservations can be made via the event's designated glamping provider, who will be responsible for the provision and servicing of tents and any other equipment and services booked.

BBQs

Cooking on the campsite and caravan areas is allowed, using purpose built camping stoves or raised BBQs only. These must not be left unattended.

No open fires are allowed. No ground BBQ's are allowed.

If you intend to cook on the campsites you must have a Fire Extinguisher, Fire Blanket, bucket of sand or water to hand.

Rubbish Disposal

Please dispose of all rubbish sensibly; we will provide campers with black refuse sacks.

Please take all rubbish home with you where possible, and recycle.

Dogs

Well-behaved dogs are welcome but must be kept under control at all times.

Please remember that this is still a live shooting ground, with loud sudden noises which can startle animals.

All owners must clean up after their dogs.

Sunday Morning Flea Market & Autojumble

Admission to the Sunday Morning Indoor Flea Market, for buyers and sellers, is by wristband only.

Pitches will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Each stall must be a maximum of 2.5m x 2.5m.

Vintage and used goods only. No new items, please.

Trading

Any unauthorised selling or trading is strictly forbidden and those responsible will be removed from the event.

First Aid

A first aid and paramedic team will be in attendance throughout the weekend.

Fire Safety

There will be trained firefighters on site. Please report any fuel leaks, unattended hot stoves etc immediately.

Security

A licensed security team will be available to assist you, day or night. Please report any problems immediately.

Photography, Video and Audio Recording

Photography and video recording is allowed for personal use.

Any form of recording for commercial purposes requires the express permission of Maine Events Ltd t/as The Hot Rod Havride.

Unauthorised commercial use of video, audio, photography or other recording will be subject to retrospective licensing fees.

Your attendance at the event is on the understanding that pictures or video obtained by official press photographers and videographers may be used for promotion of future events and/or media publication or broadcast.

Programme of Events

We reserve the right to alter or amend the programme of events at any time.

All bands, entertainment, displays and attractions are booked in good faith and details are correct at time of going to press.

Other Useful Information

Event Programmes

Free event programmes will be available on the day and will include full event timetables, useful information and a Site Map of Bisley Camp showing the locations of toilets, showers, entertainment, food, bar and camping areas.

Local Supermarket and Fuel

Turn left out of the camp
At the end of Queens Rd turn right at the lights
The supermarket and shop is on the left after approx. 1.5 miles

Nearest Shop for Basic Provisions - Spar

Turn right out of the camp
At end of the road turn right
The Spar shop is on the right after approx 0.5 mile

Railway Station - Brookwood Takeaways and Restaurants

Turn right out of the camp
At the end of the road turn left, and keep going left into Brookwood
The Station is on the right
You will find various chip shops, takeaways and restaurants in the village

Accident & Emergency - Frimley Park Hospital (7 miles)

Turn right out of the camp
At the end of the road turn left
Pass under the railway bridge and turn immediate right into Gole Road
Stay on this road until the roundabout, then take 2nd exit to Frimley Green Road
At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit to Frimley High Street
At the next roundabout take the 3rd exit to Portsmouth Road
At the next roundabout take the 4th exit to the Hospital

The Detonators Dust-Up Rules & Regulations

The Detonators Dust-Up is a traditional oval dirt track event at Tongham Raceway, hosted by the Detonators Car Club as part of the programme of events at the Hot Rod Hayride.

Admission will be strictly by Hot Rod Hayride event Wristband, purchased in advance. No on-the-day tickets will be available.

Racing will take place on Saturday from 12.00 until approximately 15.00.

Please adhere to all rules stated below and to the directions and instructions of Marshals, Security, Medical Staff and any other Event Officials on the day.

There will be a single class entry for 4-wheeled, pre-1966 vehicles. Competitors will be drawn in pairs, matching similar vehicles when possible. Vehicles will be eliminated though a series or rounds of pursuit until the final pairing when a champion will be declared.

Vehicles taking part must be in the spirit of traditional Hot Rods, Customs, Pick-Ups.

Entry requirements - Vehicles

- Vehicles must be pre-1966 (up to December 1966)
- Vehicles must be road legal and driven to the event
- Safe and effective seat belts or lap belts must be fitted and worn
- Tyres must have road legal tread
- Hub caps and beauty trim rings to be removed
- Headlights must be taped over or removed
- Fenders/mudguards can be removed
- · Open headers are permitted
- Catch cans for radiator and oil breathers should be fitted
- Carburettor return springs must be fitted
- Batteries must be strapped down securely
- Vehicles will be scrutineered for condition and safety, and to ensure compliance with the above requirements
- Scrutineers' decisions regarding eligibility will be final

Entry Requirements - Drivers

Before being allowed on track, you must:

- Present your vehicle for scrutineering
- Present your helmet/gloves/eye protection for scrutineering
- Present a full valid driving licence
- Sign on at the track and obtain your Event Licence
- · Attend the Drivers' Safety Briefing
- Drivers of open-topped vehicles must wear a crash helmet, gloves, eye protection and a long-sleeved top
- Drivers of vehicles with no screen fitted must wear a crash helmet, gloves, eye protection and a long-sleeved top
- Minimum age for participation is 18
- Co-drivers or passengers will not be allowed

Information for Drivers and Visitors

- Speed Limit There will be a speed limit of 5mph in all public areas on the site as a guide, you should be driving/riding at walking pace
- Access Roadways must be kept clear at all times for emergency access
- Parking Please follow the instructions of the Parking Stewards and park only in the designated areas There
 is disabled parking and ample spectator car parking with a separate designated area for pre-66 vehicles
- Eye Protection On dry days, the track can become very dusty, so we recommend that suitable eye protection is worn by all attendees
- Noise Vehicles taking part on the oval track can be loud, so please consider wearing ear protection when in close proximity of the track
- First Aid Qualified first Aiders will be on site throughout
- Facilities There are toilets, a food concession and limited seating on site You can bring your own food and drink and folding chairs (gazebos are not permitted) please dispose of rubbish responsibly
- Trespass Tongham Raceway is on private land Please do not drive or walk anywhere beyond the event boundary
- Awards Trophies will be presented at the end of the event
